## **Village Hall News**

It was 20 months ago that we embarked on a mission to save the Village Hall from bankruptcy and clear the rebuild debt. In just 18 months this was achieved – £40,000 plus has been repaid and the Village Hall is now clear of debt.

#### Why have loans?

We have heard the odd comment about why it was necessary to take on loans and perhaps we should explain. Many promises of financial support were given by organisations, unfortunately at the 11th hour, some reneged on their promises. It was not considered sensible or justifiable to halt the project and thus the loans came into being.

It is important that recognition is given to the fact that although supported by the Parish Council, the repayment of the loans were made entirely from monies raised by Village Hall funds.

#### Continued bookings essential

Now that loans are repaid, the need to take all and any bookings has receded. On the other hand, with the best will in the world, community based projects will not keep the wolves at bay and the hall will need to be hired at a reasonable level in order to cover the extremely high cost of simply contd. p2
